Project BRIDGE is a workforce development and financial literacy program designed to assist under- or un-employed men and women with their job and career goals.

Who Is Eligible?

- Must live in Fairfax County;
- Must be motivated to focus on workforce development, open to financial literacy education, and willing to establish job and life skills that will lead to self-sufficiency;
- Must have a high school diploma or GED;
- Must have basic computer skills, and regular access to email; and
- Must be able to communicate in English.

What Are The Types of Assistance Provided Through Project BRIDGE?

- Resume writing;
- Workforce development and career planning;
- Referrals to and assistance with educational, job training, or professional certification programs;
- Workshops focused on career planning and job search strategies;
- Professional and social networking events; and
- Financial literacy and budgeting education.
