"Britepaths Saved My Life"

"Amey" and her family were burdened with business and medical debt and on the brink of eviction when she contacted Britepaths and the Financial Empowerment Center at South County (FECSoCo) in the summer of 2020.

Working with her volunteer Financial Mentor Dennis Elias over the past year, and with support from our Food Bridge program and other resources Dennis helped her access, Amey and her husband have been able to catch up on their rent, pay off \$6,000 worth of debt, start building their savings through our Matched Savings Program, and are starting to plan for buying a home.

Dennis is a Certified Financial Planner (CFP®), and his work with Amey was detailed in an article by our grantor the Foundation for Financial Planning (FFP), which encourages professionals like Dennis to provide pro bono financial coaching to community members who are struggling. FFP has provided funding for our Financial Mentoring and Coaching services at Britepaths and FECSoCo since 2013, and also awarded us a Communities of Color grant with BNY Mellon's Pershing to further the outreach we have long been conducting in our community.

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Your Support Fights Local Hunger



Britepaths reopened our Food Pantry in August after closing in March 2020. It is so great to see our families again!

September was Hunger Action Month in Fairfax County and across the U.S. There are numerous ways your support for our work is helping ensure that our neighbors in crisis have sustenance while they work toward stability.

In 2020, Britepaths' Food Bridge program provided food services to 734 unduplicated households, impacting 2,631 individuals, including 1,227 children in those

homes. This includes Covid CARES Act food assistance, delivered food, emergency food, and fresh produce boxes that were delivered to families in quarantine due to Covid in the Alexandria area, in a pandemic pivot for the Our Daily Veggies program. Our Food4Thought program served 1,309 students in 20 FCPS partner schools.

This year, we are distributing Our Daily Veggies vouchers again, and also helping SNAP recipients purchase fresh produce at the Annandale Farmers Market.

In addition to donating funds, grocery store gift cards and food, community members can get involved by organizing a food delivery group, running a food or gift card drive, or creating Food4Thought weekend food packs to donate to our partner schools.
